The route between Chicago and Kouts involves navigating several toll roads, including the Chicago Skyway (\$6.00) and the Indiana Toll Road on I-94/I-80/94 East (approximately \$4-8 depending on your exit). Professional movers familiar with this corridor know to use I-94 to I-80/94 for the fastest and most efficient route, typically avoiding the heaviest traffic by planning around peak commute times. Since this is a cross-state move, you'll also want to consider factors like updating your driver's license, vehicle registration, and voter registration—Indiana residents have 60 days to update their credentials after establishing residency. Having a moving company that factors toll costs into their estimates upfront eliminates surprise charges and helps you budget accurately for your relocation.

1. **\*\*Coordinate refuse service\*\***: Unlike urban areas with municipal pickup, Kouts residents typically contract with private waste management companies. Research and arrange service before your move so you can properly dispose of packing materials and other moving-related waste immediately.
