

Your Complete Guide to Moving to Ogden Dunes

Welcome to Ogden Dunes

Nestled along the southern shore of Lake Michigan, Ogden Dunes offers something increasingly rare in the Chicago metropolitan area: a true small-town lakefront community with direct access to pristine Indiana Dunes. This tight-knit Porter County town of fewer than 1,200 residents sits approximately an hour from downtown Chicago, making it an attractive option for families and professionals seeking more space, lower costs, and a slower pace of life without completely leaving the Chicago orbit. The town's defining feature is its unique location between the industrialized parts of Northwest Indiana and the protected natural beauty of the Indiana Dunes National Park.

What sets Ogden Dunes apart from other Northwest Indiana communities is its deliberately preserved natural character. Unlike many lakefront areas that have been heavily developed, Ogden Dunes maintains significant green space, wooded lots, and direct dunes access for residents. The community was founded in the 1920s as a planned residential development emphasizing harmony with nature, and that philosophy continues today. Residents enjoy private beach access, extensive hiking trails, and a genuine four-season lakefront lifestyle—all while maintaining easy access to Chicago's employment opportunities and urban amenities when desired.

Planning Your Move

Timing your move to Ogden Dunes strategically can make the entire process smoother and more cost-effective. Summer months are the most popular for family relocations, particularly June through early August, as families aim to get settled before the school year begins. If you're moving during this peak season, booking your move 3-4 weeks in advance is essential to secure your preferred date. However, fall and spring offer excellent alternatives with better availability, less competition for moving dates, and often more flexible scheduling. Cross-state moves between Illinois and Indiana require extra planning time compared to local moves, so experienced [Ogden Dunes movers handle these logistics daily and can help coordinate timing that works with your schedule.](#)

The logistics of moving between Chicago and Ogden Dunes involve more than just distance. Most moves utilize I-94 to I-80/94 East (the Indiana Toll Road), which includes several tolls: the Chicago Skyway (\$6.00) and the Indiana Toll Road (\$4-8 depending on your exit). Professional moving companies factor these costs into estimates upfront, but it's important to understand that cross-state moves also involve coordinating different state regulations, potential parking permits at both locations, and strategic timing to avoid Chicago's notorious rush hour congestion. The best moving times are mid-morning to early afternoon on weekdays, after Chicago's morning rush clears but before the evening commute begins.

Living Here

Life in Ogden Dunes represents a significant lifestyle shift from Chicago, particularly for families. The town is served by Porter County school districts, which many relocating families cite as a primary motivation for their move—smaller class sizes, excellent student-to-teacher ratios, and a strong community focus on education. The pace of daily life slows considerably here; you'll trade Chicago's density and walkability for larger lots, more parking, and a car-dependent lifestyle. However, you gain space both indoors and out, with typical homes offering substantially more square footage and yard space than comparable Chicago properties at a fraction of the cost.

Day-to-day amenities require a different approach than city living. Ogden Dunes itself is primarily residential with limited commercial development, so most shopping, dining, and services are accessed in nearby Portage, Chesterton, or Valparaiso, all within a 10-15 minute drive. The tradeoff comes in recreational opportunities: residents enjoy direct access to Lake Michigan beaches, the Indiana Dunes National Park trail system, and a genuine connection to nature that's impossible to replicate in urban settings. The community maintains its own beach and ski hill, and the tight-knit nature of the town means neighbors actually know each other. For those still commuting to Chicago, the South Shore Line train station in nearby Dune Park provides an alternative to driving, though most residents find having a car essential.

Moving Tips

1. **Book early for summer moves**: If relocating between June and August, reserve your moving date 3-4 weeks in advance to ensure availability during this peak family moving season.
1. **Plan for tolls and timing**: Budget approximately \$10-15 in toll costs per vehicle and schedule your move to avoid Chicago rush hours (before 9 AM or after 3 PM for best results).
1. **Verify parking access**: While Ogden Dunes streets are generally more accessible than Chicago, confirm that your moving truck can access your specific property, especially if you have a narrow driveway or wooded lot with low-hanging branches.
1. **Coordinate utilities in advance**: Because this is a smaller community, utility connections may require more lead time than in Chicago. Contact providers at least two weeks before your move date.
1. **Prepare for the lifestyle shift**: If moving from Chicago, ensure you have reliable vehicles ready, as you'll be driving significantly more for daily errands and activities.
1. **Check homeowners association rules**: Some Ogden Dunes neighborhoods have specific regulations about moving truck access, parking, and move-in hours—verify

these requirements before moving day.
