

# Your Complete Guide to Moving to Valparaiso, Indiana

Cross-state relocations between Illinois and Indiana involve additional considerations beyond typical local moves. You'll need to factor in toll costs along your route, including the Indiana Toll Road (\$4-8 depending on your exit) and the Chicago Skyway (\$6.00). Most movers use I-94 to I-80/94 for the fastest route, typically taking about an hour under normal traffic conditions. However, Chicago rush hour congestion can significantly impact timing, so professional moving companies typically plan around these windows—generally avoiding weekday departures between 7-9 AM and 3-6 PM. Since you're moving across state lines, you'll also want to update your driver's license, vehicle registration, and insurance within 60 days of establishing residency.
